Speaking in tribute to Mrs. Nollen will be Dr. Joseph F. Wall, dean of Grinnell College; Professor John Pitsch; and Gregory L. Vanciger, a member of Triars, senior honorary society in which President and Mrs. Nollen had a special interest.

The daughter of Edward and Anna Jane Bairstow O'Fs, Mrs. Nollen was born Dec. 16, 1877, at Lynnfield, Mass. She was graduated from Vassar College, received a master's degree from Brown University, and taught in New England schools.

Married in 1911

She was married to Dr. Nollen in 1911, and the couple moved to Grinnell in 1921 when he became dean of the faculty at the college. Dr. Nollen served as president of the college until 1940. He died on May 13, 1952.

A friendly and gracious person, Mrs. Nollen remained active and interested in community and college life up to the time of her death at the age of 93. A world
