Heart Attack Claims Life of Vernon Orban

Vernon Orban, 62, advertising manager of the Brooklyn Chronicle the past year and a half died at 12:30 Wednesday morning at University hospital, Iowa City.

He had entered the hospital in September for possible heart surgery. While at the hospital undergoing tests for the surgery, he suffered three heart attacks in one day and has been in critical condition since that time. However, his condition had improved in the past few days and doctors were in hopes that he would be able to go to the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ray Orban at LeMars.

He suffered the fatal heart attack at midnight and died 30 minutes later.

Funeral services are still pending at press time but will probably be Friday or Saturday at the Luken's Funeral Home in LeMars.

While in Brooklyn, he had been active in many community affairs. He was serving as president of Commercial Club at the time he became ill. He had been a Little League coach, was a member of the Jaycees, and had been active in the Methodist church.
