Fleming Thomas Orr, son of Robert and Mary Jane Brady Orr, was born October 7, 1887, near Brooklyn and died March 1, 1966, at his home in Brooklyn of a heart attack. He had been confined to his home for the past year.

Funeral services for F. T. Orr, 78, of Brooklyn, were held this afternoon (Thursday) from the Grace Methodist church in Brooklyn.

Officiating was the Rev. C. W. Woollard, pastor. Interment was in the I.O.O.F. cemetery at Brooklyn.

Mr. Orr died Tuesday afternoon at his home where he had been confined for the past year after suffering a stroke.

He had owned and operated a farm equipment business in Brooklyn and had served on the Brooklyn Volunteer Fire Department for many years. He was a veteran of World War I.
