

Woman Killed in Head-on Collision

Linda L. O'Leary, 25, of Genoa, Mo., was killed in a head-on collision with a car driven by her husband, 31, on Highway 33 Tuesday evening.

Miss O'Leary was a passenger in the car driven by her husband, 31, near Genoa, Mo., Tuesday evening. The car was a 1961 Buick Wildcat, a four-door sedan, registered in Pottawatomie County, Mo., for this year.

According to Pottawatomie County Sheriff Max Allen, the O'Leary car was northbound on Highway 33 at about 5:30 p.m. when it was struck by a southbound car driven

by Lance Noble, 19, of Genoa. The Buick vehicle apparently crossed the center line of the highway.

O'Leary's injuries in the collision were reported as satisfactory condition at University Hospital in Iowa City, Mo., where she is recovering from multiple lacerations. Miss O'Leary's sister, Roberta Marie Poe, 14, of Genoa, Mo., is also reported to be in satisfactory condition with no injuries.

Charges of failure to yield the right-of-way on the highway were filed on Miss Poe. Combined damages amount to \$2,000.

Miss O'Leary was born April 3, 1936, in St. Charles, Mo., the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Willie Mills. She was a graduate of Nes-

bitch Senior High School, a member of the Methodist Episcopal church. She was employed by Genoa Telephone Company in Genoa.

Survivors of the collision include her husband, Willie Mills, of St. Charles, Mo.; her father, Mr. DeAnn Leamon, of Iowa City, and Mrs. Willie Bern Nicolls, of St. Charles, Mo.; her grandmother, Mrs. John Mills, of Nevada, Mo.

Funeral services are pending at the Breuninger Funeral Home in Genoa, Mo.
