The Killer Said: "I Was Crazy Drunk"

Miss Park Was On Her Way Home From A Summer In The West

Miss Ada C Park, highly esteemed Grinnell lady; met death by strangulation on the Southern Pacific Golden State: Limited between Bisbee and Douglas, Arizona, about 3 o'clock this morning. Miss Park had spent the summer in the west, visiting her brother Hubbard in Marina, Calif., and a niece, Mrs. Daniel T. Gnau. of Phoenix, Ariz. She was a passenger on an eastbound train, on her trip home. She was 70 years old in June.

She was attacked in her lower birth A man giving giving his name as Howard Lantz was arrested and according to Police Chief Percy Bowden of Doug-Chief Percy Bowden of Doug-las, Ariz, has confessed and has expressed his willingness to sign a written statement. Apparently the act was committed in a drunken frenzy. According to Chief Bowden, Lantz said, "I was crazy drunk." The accus-ted man's face bore scratches, showing that Miss Park had fought for her life.

According to the story of the crime given by Chief Bowden, Lantz rushed up to the conduct-tor and said, "A man just killed a woman back there and jumped off the train." He explained the scratches—on-his face by saying
