MRS. A. J. PEARCE

The Iowa Falls Sentinel publishes an obituary notice of Mrs. A. J. Pearce, formerly of Grinnell, who died there last week. Mrs. Pearce is well remembered and sincerely mourned by many Grinnell friends. The obituary follows:

Mrs. A. J. Pearce passed away at her home Thursday, October 25. She had been in feeble health for about eight years, and had been confined to her bed the past month. Funeral services were held at Dick's Undertaking Parlors Saturday forenoon at ten o'clock and were in charge of Rev. W. J. Hadley. Interment was made in Union cemetery.
