Hollis Phipps, 55, of 1924 Sixth Ave., Grinnell, died of a heart ailment at his home Tuesday afternoon, June 19.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Friday at the First Baptist Church, with the Rev. Robert C. Smith officiating. Burial will be at Hazelwood Cemetery, with the Smith Funeral Home in charge of arrangements.
