Kellogg Man Killed In One-Car Mishap

Arthur Harry Pietz, 21, of rural Kellogg, was dead on arrival at Skiff Hospital Saturday morning as the result of injuries suffered in a one-car accident at the east edge of Newton on Highway 6.

According to Newton police, Pietz, driving a 1964 model car, struck a barricade blocking County Road W as he was eastbound on Highway 6. The vehicle continued on, sheered off a utility pole and came to rest in a neighboring yard. The vehicle was demolished.

Pietz was taken to Skiff by ambulance shortly after 6 a.m. He reportedly suffered a broken neck, multiple fractures of the chest and arms and lacerations.

Funeral services for Mr. Pietz were held at 1:30 p.m. today (Mon-

day) at the Toland Funeral Home in Newton. Burial was in Our Silent City Cemetery in Kellogg where military graveside rites were conducted.

A resident of the Kellogg community for seven years, Mr. Pietz was born in Brainerd, Minn., and was educated in Brainerd schools. He was married to Linda Middleton on March 29, 1966 in Fort Knox, Ky.

A turret lathe operator in Fisher Governor Company in Marshalltown, Mr. Pietz served for 13 months in Korea and for six months in Vietnam before his discharge from the Army in May, 1967.

Survivors include his wife, Linda; a brother, Kenneth; and his parents, Ernest and Evelyn Hanson Pietz, all of Kellogg.
