

Mrs. Clarence Quaife Passes

Beloved Wife and Mother Passes
in Galesburg, Ill.; Remembered

Here as Edith Stickle

June 9 — 1934.

The sad news reached Grinnell Saturday of the death in Galesburg, Ill., of Mrs. Clarence Quaife. Mrs. Quaife is remembered here as Edith Stickle. She graduated from the School of Music of Grinnell College in 1900. Her husband was a member of the same class. Dr. and Mrs. Quaife have been residents of Galesburg for many years. Dr. Quaife is a successful practitioner there and he and Mrs. Quaife have been active in everything that pertained to the good of their home community. They have been in Grinnell frequently at reunions of their college class. Mrs. Quaife is survived by her husband and one son and is mourned also by the many friends whom she has won by her genial, wholesome nature and by the many fine qualities which distinguished her as a wife and mother.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon from the Congregational church in Galesburg. One of the officiating clergymen was Rev. Harvey Young, a Grinnell College graduate in 1912 and now pastor of one of the Congregational

churches in Galesburg. Mr. and Mrs. A. L. Frisbie and son drove from Grinnell to be present.

The following obituary notice appeared in the Galesburg Register-Mail of Friday, June 8:

"Mrs. Edith M. Quaife of 1008 North Cherry street, former president of the Galesburg Woman's club and the wife of Dr. C. E. Quaife, died at 9:30 o'clock this morning at the Galesburg Cottage hospital following a serious illness of more than two months.

"She was conscious almost to the last and was particularly happy yesterday when able to personally give a graduation present to her son, Clarence, one of the members of the Galesburg high school 1934 commencement class, when he visited her at the hospital.

"Mrs. Quaife was born in Grinnell, Ia., Feb. 20, 1877, and was the daughter of C. S. and Nancy Stickle. With the exception of a few years when the family resided in Pekin, Ill., she lived in Grinnell until after her marriage.

"She attended the public schools in Grinnell and was graduated from the high school there in 1895 and from the Conservatory of Music at Grinnell College in 1900.

"On New Year's eve, 1902, she was married to Dr. C. E. Quaife at her home in Grinnell. They were members of the same class in college, her husband taking the literary course. After their marriage they lived in LaSalle, Ill., for a year and then moved to Louisville, Ky., where they resided until they came to Galesburg in 1910.

"Besides her husband and son, Clarence, one sister, Mrs. John E. Bull of Calgary, Alberta, survives. One daughter, Marion, is deceased. Her sister came from Alberta a few days ago to visit her and the family.

"Mrs. Quaife was one of Galesburg's best known women. She had been a member of Central church since soon after coming to Galesburg. Besides serving as president of the Galesburg Woman's club two terms in 1928 and 1929, she was a member of the board at the time of her death. She had also served as president of the P. T. A. of the Hitchcock school and of the Galesburg high school, was a member of the Eastern Stars, the Galesburg Musicians' club, the Study club and several social clubs. She was also a member of Mu chapter at Grinnell of Pi Kappa Lambda, a national musical fraternity."
