GILMAN (Special)—Mrs. Luther (Leola) Randall of Gilman died Sunday, June 18, at her home. She had been in failing health for over a year.

The daughter of Rufus and Laura Steiner Silence, she was born Dec. 28, 1894, in Geneva, Iowa. She attended grade and high school in Marshalltown and later attended college in Cedar Falls. 6/18/72

She taught in some of the rural schools and later taught in the La Moille Consolidated Schools.
