

Max Raymond

Max K. Raymond, 76, of 102 Delores Dr., Gilman, died Monday, May 29, at Grandview Heights in Marshalltown.

Funeral services were conducted Thursday at the Gilman Community United Church of Christ, with the Rev. Stephen G. Miller officiating. Organist was Larry Koepnick, and vocalist was Ronald Rainey.

Mr. Raymond managed Barlow's Restaurant in Marshalltown, and in 1948 he moved to Gilman where he owned and operated Raymond's Cafe. He was later employed by Marshalltown Manufacturing Co., retiring in 1975. He was married to Hazel Kyinlaug on Sept. 26, 1958 in Gilman.

Mr. Raymond was a former mayor of Gilman, a charter member and past president of the Gilman Saddle Club and the Gilman Lions Club, and a former member of Marshalltown Anson's semi-professional baseball team. He was also a member of the Gilman Community United Church of Christ, the Paul Ward American Legion Post of Gilman, and the I Club.

Surviving are his wife, Hazel; one daughter, Sharon Koepnick of LeGrand; one son, Ronald Rainey of LeGrand; and four grandchildren; He was preceded in death by his parents, two brothers and two sisters.
