H. W. Reichelt, Former Kellogg Mayor, Dies

Hugo William Reichelt, 86, who had served as mayor of Kellogg for 14 years when he resigned three weeks ago, died June 9, at a hospital in Newton.

Funeral services were held on Wednesday at the Kellogg Lutheran church and burial was in

Our Silent City cemetery at Kellogg.

Reichelt is survived by his widow Gloria; a daughter, Mrs. George (Katharine) Schaumberg of Kellogg; a son, Sherman Reichelt of Kellogg; three grandchildren; and a great grandson.

He is also survived by five sisters, Mrs. Emma Hammer of Newton, Miss Madeline Reichelt of Los Angeles, Calif., Mrs. Tillie Oltman of Mapleton, Mrs. Estella Tucker of Marshalltown, and Mrs. Clara Hanna of Burlington; two brothers, Carl Reichelt of Kellogg and Dr. Walter Reichelt of Dunlap; and a number of nieces and nephews.

His parents, a sister, brother and grandson preceded him in death.

Mr. Reichelt was the son of Charles and Rebecca Bobzin Reichelt and was born Sept. 6, 1875, north of Kellogg. He was educated in the Jasper county schools, and went to North Dakota in 1902 before he returned to Kellogg in 1905.

On Nov. 26, 1903, he married Gloria Thon. Reichelt was a member of the Kellogg Lutheran church, the Knights of Pythias and Elks in Newton.
