

Jessie Reynolds Dies At Hospital ^{HR}

The daughter of Austin and
Sarah Garrity Reynolds, Mrs.
Reynolds was born Sept. 5, 1879,
at Foster, Ill. She came to Iowa
with her family in 1901 and lived
north of Kellogg for one year.

In 1902, her family moved to
Grinnell. Later Miss Reynolds be-
gan nurses' training at Kansas

City, Mo., and in 1916 she grad-
uated from the School of Nursing
at The University of Iowa.

Miss Reynolds served as a nurse
at St. Francis Hospital until 1932
when she returned to University
Hospitals in Iowa City. She con-
tinued her nursing duties in Iowa
City until 1951 when she returned
to Grinnell to make her home.
Following her retirement, she did
part time and special nursing at
St. Francis Hospital until her
health began to fail.

Miss Reynolds is survived by
two sisters — Mrs. Cora Hum-
mel and Mrs. Carrie Shults, both
of Grinnell; her sister-in-law, Mrs.
D. M. Reynolds of Grinnell; a
nephew, Kenneth Hummel of Phoe-
nix, Ariz.; a great-nephew, and
a great-great-niece and nephew.
Mrs. Reynolds was preceded in
death by her parents and her
brother, Dan M. Reynolds on Sept.
21, 1969.
