Janet Richman Dies in Crash

Mrs. Janet Vogt Richman, a former Grinnell resident who was living at 424 Clark St., Iowa City, was killed instantly Monday morning in a one-car crash near West Liberty, Iowa.

Mrs. Richman was a speech therapist for the Scott-Muscatine County School Systems and a teacher in the system's special education department. She was en route from her home in Iowa City to her job in Muscatine when the accident occurred.

The daughter of Mrs. Martha Vogt and the late Paul E. Vogt, she was born in Grinnell May 14, 1945. She attended the Grinnell schools and graduated from high school here with the class of 1963. While in high school she was homecoming queen during her senior year.

In 1967, she graduated from Northwestern University in Evanston, Ill., with a bachelor of science degree. While attending Northwestern she was a member of Pi Beta Phi social sorority. In the summer of 1969 she received her master of arts degree at the University of Iowa in speech pathology.

She was married to Lynn Charles Richman on Aug. 8, 1969, in Herrick Chapel at Grinnell College. Mr. Richman is currently preparing for his Ph.D. in child psychology.

Mrs. Richman was a member of the United Methodist Church

in Grinnell, as well as Chapter JB of the PEO sisterhood.

She is survived by her husband Lynn; her mother, Mrs. Martha Vogt of Grinnell; her sister, Mrs. Frederic H. (Katherine Ann) Brock of Allentown, Pa.; her maternal grandmother, Mrs. Katie Adamson of Ankeny; a niece, Christine Ann Brock of Allentown; and several uncles, aunts and cousins. She was preceded in death by her father, Paul E. Vogt, on Dec. 1, 1968.

Funeral services for Mrs. Richman were held at 2 p.m. today (Thursday) at the Grinnell United Methodist Church, with the Rev. J. Eugene Young officiating. Organist was Mrs. Willard Heffner. Pallbearers included R. Victor Bailey, Warren Beaty, William E. Caughey, Martin E. Church, Joseph D. Danforth and Kenneth Vogt. Burial was in Hazelwood cemetery.
