Raymond F. Rolf, 72, of Marshalltown, formerly of Grinnell, died Friday, Oct. 28, at his home.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at Elim Lutheran Church of Marshalltown, with the Rev. James Hougen officiating. Burial was in Rose Hill Memorial Gardens, with military rites conducted by the Conrad American Legion.

He was the son of Arthur and Mary Walters Rolf and was born Feb. 21, 1922, in Northboro. He was raised in the Shenandoah area and graduated from Clarinda High School. He served with the U.S. Air force during World War II.

He was married to Betty Mae Mondt Sept. 12, 1946, in Pender, Neb. The couple later moved to Grinnell where he was employed by DeKalb for 13 years. From 1959 to 1964 he owned and operated the George and Rolf Hardware Store. He later worked as a feed salesman for the Walnut Grove division of the W.R. Grace Co.

The couple moved to Marshalltown in 1966 where Mr. Rolf became affiliated with Preferred Triad Realty as a sales associate. He retired in May of this year.

He was a member of the Elim Lutheran Church, the Grinnell and Marshalltown B.P.O. Elks lodges, the Marshalltown Noon Lions Club, the Grinnell and Conrad American Legion posts, the Marshalltown Board of Realtors, the Iowa Association of Realtors and the National Association of Realtors. He was a former member of the Grinnell Jaycees.

Surviving are his wife, Betty; two daughters, Beverly Pagel of Des Moines and Patricia Gustafson of Grinnell; one sister, Esther Scott of Oakbrook, Ill.; two brothers, Walter and Donald, both of Shenandoah; and four grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents.
