QUENTIN E. ROSE

Quentin E. Rose, 68, of Deep River, passed away at his home on June 8, 1987.

He was born on July 10, 1918, near Guernsey, Iowa, the son of Earl F. and Flora Rinehart Rose. He graduated from Guernsey High School in 1936 and attended William Penn College. In April 1941 he entered the U.S. Army and served with the 34th Div. during World War II. He was honorably discharged in July 1945.

On January 25, 1946, he was united in marriage with Margery Hall at Marengo. They made their home in Deep River. Quentin was a retired grocer. He was a member of the Morrison-Schrader American Legion Post 296; VFW Post 788 at Cedar Rapids and the Masonic Lodge. He was a former member of the Deep River Volunteer Fire Department.
