Clinton Ryan Dies At 76, Rites Friday

Funeral services will be held at 10:30 a.m. tomorrow at St. Patrick's Catholic church, Brooklyn, for Clinton Ryan, 76, a Brooklyn native and prominent attorney, who died Tuesday at St. Francis Hospital where he had been taken earlier in the day.

Ryan served as Poweshiek county attorney from 1963 through 1966.

Mr. Ryan's son, Father Phillip Ryan of Clinton, will deliver the sermon at the Friday services. The Knights of Columbus will attend the funeral services and the Brooklyn American Legion will conduct graveside military rites. Burial will be in Calvary cemetery in Brooklyn.

The son of Reuben T. Ryan and Julia Doyle, Mr. Ryan was born Dec. 9, 1890. He was graduated from Brooklyn high school in 1908 and from Drake University law school in 1912. He attended Sorbonne University in Paris following World War I.

He married Rose Hansen on June 21, 1921.

Mr. Ryan was active in law practice and shared offices with attorney Richard P. Frantz. He was a veteran of World War I, past commander of the Brooklyn American Legion Post, and served as Poweshiek County Attorney.

Survivors include his widow; three sons—Thomas, James, and Phillip; one daughter—Joan; one sister—Mrs. E. J. Stirnman of Brooklyn; two brothers—Paul of Colorado Springs, Colorado, and Thomas of Brooklyn; and nine grandchildren.

One son, Jerome, and two infant children preceded him in death.

Clinton E. Ryan

Clinton E. Ryan, son of Reuben T. Ryan and Julia Doyle Ryan, was born Dec. 9, 1890, in Brooklyn, and died March 14, 1967, in St. Francis hospital at Grinnell where he had been admitted earlier the same day.

He graduated from Brooklyn High School in 1908 and from Drake University Law school in Des Moines in 1912. He also attended Sorbonne University in Paris following World War I. Mr. Ryan had been a Brooklyn attorney for many years and was in his office the day before his death. He was married to Rose Hansen on June 1, 1921, and five children were born to the couple.

A veteran of World War I, he was past commander of the Brooklyn American Legion post and had served as Poweshiek county attorney. He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Rose Ryan of Brooklyn; three sons, Thomas Ryan of Cedar Falls, the Rev. Phillip Ryan of Clinton, and James Ryan, at home; one daughter, Mrs. Lenard (Joan) Heath of Dubuque; nine grandchildren; a sister, Mrs. E. J. Stirnman of Brooklyn; and two brothers, Paul Ryan of Colorado Springs, Colo. and Thomas Ryan of Brooklyn. He was preceded in death by a son, Jerome, in 1947.

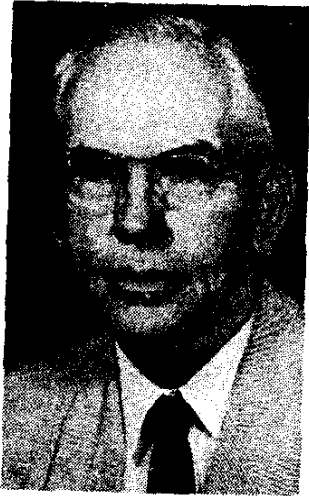
Funeral services were conducted Friday, March 17, at 10:30 a.m. at St. Patrick's church with his son, the Rev. Phillip Ryan of Clinton, serving as celebrant of the solemn requiem mass. Clint Ryan Dies at 76; Was County Attorney



Services will be March 17, 10:30 a.m. at St. Patrick's church for Clinton E. Ryan, Brooklyn attorney, who passed away March 15 at a Grinnell hospital. He was 76 years old, and has recently completed two terms as Poweshiek county attorney.

Ryan was born in 1890, son of Rueben and Julia Ryan at Brooklyn. He is a graduate of Brooklyn high and Drake Law School. A veteran of World War I, Ryan served the American Legion in many ways, including the office of commander of the post at Brooklyn.

A life-long Democrat, Ryan served as finance chairman and on the county ticket as early as 1924. He was elected county attorney in 1962 and 1964.

Ryan was a member of St. Patricks' Catholic Church of Brooklyn, the Knights of Columbus and the Iowa State Bar Association.
