**Ruby Sanders
Passed Away
At Age 46**

Ruby, daughter of Ethel and Eldon Hines, was born at St. Anthony, Sept. 29, 1915, and passed away at the Mahaska hospital, Oskaloosa, Sept. 29, at 46 years of age.

She attended school locally, and graduated from Clements high school in 1933. In her youth she became a member of the Christian church, later transferring her membership to the Barnes City Methodist church.

She was united in marriage with Lowell Eley, May 14, 1935, and to this union two daughters were born. In 1949, her husband was fatally injured in an accident while constructing a silo.

She was united in marriage with Philip Sanders, Mar. 26, 1954. They have made their home in the Barnes City and Deep River communities.

Ruby was an active member in her church, serving as a counselor in the M.Y.F. and as a member of the choir.
