Harry Lytton Savage, 87, of Lynnville died Tuesday, Aug. 11, at St. Francis Manor in Grinnell.

Funeral services were conducted Monday at the Lynnville Friends Church, with the Rev. Tom Vander Well officiating. Burial was in Friends Cemetery, Lynnville.

The son of Charles Fitz and Carrie Aseneth Long Savage, he was born March 26, 1905, in Belinda, Iowa. He lived in the Milo area most of his life and attended schools there.

He was married to Mabel Louise Scull June 15, 1929, and the couple lived in Lynnville where Mr. Savage was a barber. The couple moved to Des Moines in 1943 when he became a railway mail clerk. He retired in 1969, and the

couple returned to Lynnville in 1982.

He attended the Lynnville Friends Church and was a member of the Lebanon Masonic Lodge of Lynnville, the Railway Mail Association, the National Horseshoe Pitchers Association and the Iowa Horseshoe Pitchers Association. He was past president of the Iowa association and was elected to that group's Hall of Fame.

Mr. Savage is survived by two daughters, Janice Bailey of Tucson, Ariz., and Louise Rudkin of Coralville; seven grandchildren; and one sister Minnie Weir of Melcher. He was preceded in death by his wife; one daughter, Gloria; two grandchildren; his parents; two sisters and five brothers. *H-R*
