

Arline D. Shields Succumbs Sunday; Tuesday Services

Mrs. Arline D. Shields, 85, a resident of the Mayflower Home for the past seven years, died here Sunday.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Tuesday from the Rush-Smith funeral home in Salina, Kan. Memorial services will be held locally at the Mayflower Home at 4:30 p.m. Tuesday with the Rev. Robert Dewey, minister of the Congregational church, officiating. Burial will be in Gypsum Hill cemetery at Salina.

Born Aug. 6th, 1877, at Salina, Kan., she was the daughter of Allen L. and Louis Blair Dodge. A graduate of Salina high school, she taught in Salina for two years. She married David H. Shields on July 11th, 1901.

At that time she was the organist and the minister of the Salina Christian church.

As a pastor's wife, she lived in Salina, Kan.; Eureka, Ill.; Kokomo, Ind.; Minneapolis, Minn.; Canton, Mo.; Ottawa, Kan.; and Mitchellville, Iowa.

Mrs. Shields is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Charles L. Kaufman of Grinnell. Also surviving are three brothers, Allen W. Dodge and C. B. Dodge of Salina, Kan., and Harry Dodge of Topeka, Kan.; a sister, Charlotte L. Dodge of Santa Barbara, Calif.; two grandsons, and five great grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband, David, in 1948; a daughter, Mary Arline, in 1927; and one sister, Wilma.

She belonged to Chapter BM of the P.E.O. Sisterhood in Grinnell and the Grinnell Congregational church.
