Mrs. Lottie Smith Services Tomorrow

Funeral services for Mrs. Lottie Smith, age 68, Kellogg, will be held tomorrow at 2 p.m. at the Newburg Congregational church.

Mrs. Smith died Saturday evening at a Grinnell hospital, after failing in health for some time. The Rev. Gene Mack will officiate at the services, assisted by the Rev. Mrs. Helen Turner. Burial will be in Hickory Grove Cemetery.

Mrs. Smith was born to John and Lottie Elliott Reynolds on May 7, 1891 at Odebolt. She lived near here in the Sugar Creek neighborhood for a time, and attended the Grinnell public schools. She was graduated from Grinnell high school.

The deceased and Wesley Ray Smith were married in Grinnell on September 6, 1911. They had three children: Luverne R. Smith Rte. No. 2, Kellogg; Mrs. Everett (Betty) Cooper, Rte. No. 2, Kellogg; and Mrs. Lawrence (Virginia) Stanley, Rte. 1, Kellogg.

Other surviving relatives include seven grandchildren, one great-grandchild and eight brothers and sisters.

Mrs. Smith was a member of the Newburg Congregational church, the Hickory Grove Homemakers Club, Newburg Fellowship, and the Hickory Grove E.U.B. Aid.

Lottie, daughter of Lottie Elliott and John E. Reynolds was born in Odebolt, Iowa on May 7th, 1891, and passed away in the Community hospital, Grinnell, Iowa on October 7th, 1959 at the age of 68 years and 6 months.

Lottie was unfortunate never to know a mother's love, her mother having passed away when she was but three days old. At this time she was taken into the home of her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Reynolds of Grinnell, Iowa. It was here she lived until the passing of her grandparents when she was fourteen years of age, she then made her home with her sister and brother-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. S. L. Howell of the Sugar Creek community.

She graduated from the Grinnell high school with the class of 1910, after which she took a business course in the Grinnell Academy, later she worked in the office of the Spaulding Mfg. Co.

On September 6th, 1911 she was united in marriage to Wesley Ray Smith. To this union three children were born: Luverne Reynolds, Betty and Virginia.

She joined the Congregational Church of Newburg in 1946, retaining her membership here until the time of her death. She was also a member of the Newburg Congregational Women's Fellowship, and a member of the Ladies Aid of the Hickory Grove E.U.B. Church and the

Lottie had been in poor health for a number of years, but in spite of this she had always been cheerful and courageous. Her husband preceded her in death on May 7th, 1931.
