Funeral services for Mrs. Harvey Spading were held Monday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Methodist church in Malcom with the Rev. Wilson Hyde in charge. Dorothy Elizabeth Dost, youngest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Dost, was born August 8, 1912, in Bureau county, Ill. When she was two and one-half years old she moved to Iowa, on a farm near Malcom where she resided the remainder of her life. She attended rural schools and later graduated from the Malcom high school in the class of 1930. On September 18, 1932, she was baptized and received into full membership in the Methodist Episcopal church in Malcom. She attended church regularly and was a faithful believer in the Christian faith. She was a friend of everyone and well liked by all who knew her, because of her winning smile.

On June 20, 1936, she was united in marriage to Harvey Theodore Spading of Brooklyn in the Methodist church in Rock Island, Ill. After a very short but happy married life of only two months and two days she quietly passed away Saturday morning, August 22, 1936, after a very brief illness at the home of her brother-in-law north of Brooklyn, where they had been staying during his absence. She departed from this life at the age of 24 years and 14 days.

Her character was above reproach as is evidenced by the testimonies of her many friends. In her passing the community and friends lose an exemplary young woman of high ideals. She was always willing to lend a helping hand and regarded her friends with the highest respect.
