# Duane Schnur services held

GILMAN (Special)—A former Grinnellian died of carbon monoxide poisoning on Christmas Day, 12-25-76.

Duane Schnur, 26, of rural Colo, was found Saturday morning by his mother in an enclosed garage where he had been working on a pickup truck. The death has been ruled accidental.

Funeral services were held Tuesday (Dec. 28) at the Colo United Methodist Church, with the Rev. James Louk officiating. Burial followed in the Colo Cemetery. The Ryan Funeral Home of Nevada was in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Schnur was born Dec. 6, 1950, in Grinnell to Raymond L. and Alice (Dolly) Schnur. He graduated from Colo High School in 1969 and from North Iowa Area Community College

in 1971. He was formerly employed by the J.I. Case Equipment Co. in Marshalltown.

He is survived by his parents; a brother, Gene, and a sister, Cheryl, both at home; and two grandfathers, Edwin Burchland of Gilman and William H. Schnur of Nevada. He was preceded in death by two grandmothers and an infant brother.

The Schnur family formerly lived in the Gilman area, on a farm 2½ miles northwest of town.
