### Everett Schooley Dies

Everett B. Schooley, 66, Deep River farmer, died Sept. 27, at Mahaska Hospital, following a lengthy illness.

Born June 16, 1900, in Mahaska county, he was the son of James C. and Sarah Addie McKune Schooley. Married July 24, 1926, in Poweshiek county, he had lived all his life in Mahaska and Poweshiek counties.

Surviving with his wife, Nina, are three daughters, Mrs. Harold (Esther) Steffen of Deep River, Mrs. Ira (Barbara) Ryan of Eddyville, and Mrs. Myron (Sarah) Byers of Montezuma; 11 grandchildren; one sister Mrs. Roy Watson of Searsboro, and one brother, Earl Schooley of Haviland, Kan.

Funeral services will be held at 2, Oct. 1, at Harden funeral home in New Sharon with Rev. Don Job in charge, and burial in Friends cemetery.
