Daniel C. Schultz, 49, of Grinnell died of a heart attack Saturday, July 1, at Grinnell Regional Medical Center.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at the Grinnell United Methodist Church, with the Rev. Lon Lewis, pastor of the church, and the Rev. William Calhoun, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Newton, officiating.
