

Old Time Resident ^{G-H} Of Kellogg Dies

Frederick C. Schultz passed away at the Skiff hospital in Newton on Sunday noon, July 12th where he had been a patient for a few weeks. He had been in poor health for the past four years and had taken treatments at the Mayo hospital in Rochester, Minn., in an effort to regain his health. In the early part of this year he gave up his home here in Kellogg where he had lived alone; and went to live with his daughter, Mrs. Herman Deppe, and his son Bert Schultz. But as he grew feebler and did not improve he went to the hospital hoping to find relief. Mr. Schultz had attained the age of 71 years.

Mr. Schultz was born in Germany but came to this country with his wife many years ago and was a resident of Jasper county for many years. At a very early age he was confirmed in the Lutheran church of which he was a staunch supporter and an attendant all his life until his illness. He was a man liked by his fellow citizens and a kind father to his five children who survive him. His wife and one daughter preceded him in death some years ago. The children who survive are, August Schultz; Mrs. C. C. Reichelt; Ferd Schultz; Mrs. Herman Deppe and Bert Schultz.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the Lutheran church with Rev. Krebs of Des Moines in charge. Three duets were sung by Mrs. Hospers and Mr. Birchard.

The pallbearers were Messrs. C. R. Moberly, S. A. Morris, C. W. Reichelt, Ernest Deppe, Carl Paulson and T. A. Nesmith. Interment was made in Our Silent City. Kellogg Enterprise.
