Norman Vincent Snider, 75, of Muscatine, formerly of Grinnell, died Wednesday, March 13, at Muscatine General Hospital.

The body has been cremated. A memorial service will be conducted at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at New Hope United Methodist Church in Muscatine, with the Rev. Tom Parrott officiating. A graveside service for committal of the ashes will be at 11 a.m. Wednesday at Hazelwood Cemetery.

The son of Ralph and Nerissa Green Snider, he was born Aug. 1, 1920, in Oak Park, Ill. He graduated from high school in Washington, D.C., attended Grinnell College and graduated from the University of Iowa College of Pharmacy in 1949. He worked at Cunningham Drug while attending Grinnell College.

He was a World War II veteran, serving in the South Pacific and Philippines.

Mr. Snider owned a drug store in LaPorte City before moving to Muscatine and working at Stiles Drug Store for 20 years. He also worked at Wester Drug Store in Muscatine.
