Florence Marjorie Spading, daughter of William and Hattie Ryan, was born Aug. 24, 1908, in Madison township, and died Oct. 10, 1968, at her farm home, north of Malcom.

She attended rural schools in Madison township and Brooklyn high school, where she was graduated in 1927. She taught in Madison township rural schools for several years.

Nov. 10, 1934, she was married to Ross Spading at Aledo, Ill. The couple farmed in Madison township for three years before purchasing the Sheridan township farm where she had lived since. Her husband died in 1964, but Mrs. Spading had continued the farming operation.

Mrs. Spading was a member of Brooklyn's Grace United Methodist church and of church societies. She was also a member of the Columbian club and a community club.

Surviving are four brothers, Jay O. and Willis A. Ryan of Grinnell, John A. Ryan of Belle Plaine, and Homer C. Ryan of Brooklyn. She was preceded in death by her husband, parents, and a sister, Mrs. Horace (Mary) Cory.

Florence Marjorie Spading died Thursday, Oct. 10, 1968, at her home.

The daughter of William and Hattie Brush Ryan, Mrs. Spading was born Aug. 24, 1908, in Madison Township. She attended rural school in Madison Township and then attended Brooklyn High School, graduating in 1927.

On Nov. 10, 1934, she was married to Ross Spading of the Kent community at Aledo, Ill. For three years the couple farmed in Madison Township. In 1937 they purchased a farm in Sheridan Township where they moved the following spring and where Mrs. Spading died.

Her husband died July 1, 1964. He was actively engaged in farming at that time and she had continued the farm operation until the hour of her death.

Mr. and Mrs. Spading united with the Grace Methodist church in Brooklyn March 22, 1940, where Mrs. Spading had remained as an active member. She was also a member of her church societies, the Columbian Club and her community club.

Survivors include four brothers — Jay O. and Willis M. of Grinnell, John A. of Belle Plaine, and Homer C. of Brooklyn.
