

## Spillett Funeral Held Here Sunday

Death came last Thursday afternoon to N.N. Spillett, former manager of the Brooklyn Mutual Telephone Co. He had entered St. Luke's hospital at Cedar Rapids about a week earlier for treatment of a heart ailment. He was 60 years old.

Spillett, a native of Canada, came to Brooklyn in the early 1930's to assume management of the brooklyn telephone exchange. He served as manager and treasurer of the local organization for 29 years before resigning in March, 1960.

Last rites were held Sunday afternoon at Bramer's funeral home. The Rev. C.W. Woollard, pastor of Grace Methodist church, officiated at the two o'clock service. Mrs. Ed Bartachek was organist.

Burial was in I.O.O.F. cemetery with Albert Schinckel, B.F. Hicks, Floyd McAllister, Harold Kann, Virgil Heishman and Warren Hunsberger of Des Moines serving as pallbearers. In charge of flowers were Mr. and Mrs. John Belland, Mrs. Freda Read, Mrs. Harold Kann and Mrs. Albert Schinckel.

Norman Nelson Spillett, son of John and Janet Spillett, was born Sept. 3, 1902, at Fort Williams, Ontario, Canada, and died June 27, 1963, in Cedar Rapids where he had been hospitalized about a week.

He was a member of the Methodist church and Masonic lodge in Brooklyn.

He was married Dec. 22, 1927, to Avis Judd of Brooklyn whose death occurred Sept. 22, 1935. He later married Gladys Rhubottom of Brooklyn.

Survivors include his widow, Gladys, of Brooklyn and two brothers and one sister, Arthur and Jack Spillett and Mrs. Eunice Sutherland, all of Ontario, Canada.
