Last Rites Said For Mrs. Spooner

Funeral services were held at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 23, at the Smith Funeral Home for Mrs. Maxine Spooner, 38, wife of Frank S. Spooner, Rte. 3, who died early Monday morning at University Hospitals in Iowa City. She had been seriously ill for the past several months.
