

Rites held for Mr. Stanford

Wyman A. Stanford, 80 of Toledo died Thursday, July 11, at his home.

Funeral services were conducted at 10:30 a.m. Saturday at the Henderson Funeral Home in Toledo, with the Rev. Jerry Evelizer officiating. Burial was in Rose Hill Memorial Gardens, Marshalltown.

The son of Andrew and Mary Brechtbill Stanford, he was born on May 17, 1905, at Van Cleve. The family moved to the Sheridan community, then to Washburn, and finally to Malcom. He received his education in the rural schools of Poweshiek and Black Hawk counties.

On June 15, 1929, he was married to Maxine Ferneau at Marshalltown. They farmed in the Toledo area until 1933 when they moved into Toledo. Mr. Stanford was employed at the wood-preserving plant in Tama for 17 years, worked as a fireman at the State Juvenile Home for seven years, then worked part-time for a masonry contractor in Toledo.

He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Toledo and the Tama-Toledo Fraternal Order of Eagles.
