Glenwood Stanley Jr., 85, rural Searsboro, died Sunday at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were held Thursday, Sept. 17, at Lynnville Friends Church with the Rev. Tom VanderWall, pastor of the church, officiating. Burial was in Lynnville Friends Cemetery. He was a member of the Lynnville Friends Church, American Red Cross, Iowa State Education Association and the Iowa Republican Party.

He is survived by his wife, Ruth; three daughters Louise Ortberg, Dubuque; Roberta Hoopes, Lake Forest Ill., and Lynne Watson, Waterloo; one son Glenwood Louis Stanley III., Searsboro; 14 grandchildren; 17 great grandchildren; one brother Wilbur Stanley, Searsboro, and three sisters, Luella Dillavou, Oskaloosa; Esther Savage, Mount Pleasant, and Berthamay Roberts, Newburg, Oregon.
