Mildred Stewart, 80, of 1007 Spring St., Grinnell, died suddenly Monday morning at Grinnell General Hospital of an apparent heart condition.

The daughter of William A. and Mary Ethel Treat Stewart, she was born on Oct. 16, 1890, in Grinnell. She attended the Grinnell schools and graduated with the Grinnell High School class of 1908.

Miss Stewart attended Drake University for two years and taught at the Soldiers Orphan Home in Davenport, as well as the Fort Dodge public schools. She also attended Case Western Reserve University Library School in Cleveland, Ohio, and then obtained her master's degree at the University of Illinois.

She was head of the technology department at Cleveland Public Library for 10 years, and later a library assistant at Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland. She made her home for the past 10 years in Grinnell.

Miss Stewart was a member of Chapter BM PEO; Order of the Eastern Star, Chapter 47; Attawasias Club; the D.A.R.; O.A.C.; and the Grinnell Museum Society. She is survived by her mother, Mary Ethel, and her sister, Miss Helen T. Stewart, both of Grinnell.

Services for Miss Stewart will be held at 10 a.m. Friday, Jan. 29, at the Smith Funeral Home, with Harry M. Reynolds officiating. Organist will be Mrs. Willard Heffner.
