Donald Stone, of Brooklyn, died Sunday, May 9 in the VA Hospital, Iowa City.

Funeral Services for Mr. Stone will be held at 10:30 a.m., Wednesday, May 12, in St. Patrick's Catholic Church, Brooklyn. The Pastor, Rev. Fr. Joe Rogers, will officiate. The organist will be Mrs. Marilyn Kriegel and the soloist will be Mrs. Angie Hawkins. Flower attendants will be Mrs. Charlotte Roudabush and Mrs. Shirley Dunham.
