MRS. J. M. STURTEVANT PASSES
Well Beloved Wife of Former Congre-
gational Pastor Passes Away
At Home Near Boston

Through the courtesy of Mrs. R. D. Jones of Cambridge, we have received notice of the death of Mrs. J. M. Sturtevant who died Jan. 3 at Winchester, Mass., a suburb of Boston. Her age was 77 years.

From the Boston Transcript of Jan. 4, we take the following clipping:

"Mrs. Katherine Hayward Sturtevant, wife of Rev. Julian M. Sturtevant, a retired Congregational clergyman, died suddenly yesterday in Winchester. She was a native of Exeter, N. H., and the daughter of John T. K. Hayward, at one time mayor of Bangor, Me., and later engaged in railroading in the Middle West. During her married life Mrs. Sturtevant had lived at various places, the last few years having been divided between Chicago and Cleveland. There are two surviving daughters, Mrs. Charles F. Dutch of Winchester and Mrs. Amy S. Hobbart of New York city, and a son, Hayward Sturtevant of St. Louis, Mo. There also are three brothers in the West."

It is unnecessary to say anything complimentary of Mrs. Sturtevant to our many older residents still living. Few pastors ever had a stronger hold upon his church than did Dr. Sturtevant during his long pastorate here. He was loved with a devotion few pastors enjoy and his lovely wife was a great help to him in his ministrations here. Her sweet gentle manner appealed to all and the memory of her residence here has always been one of deepest love to the many friends here still living.
