Jerry Switzer rites Tuesday

Jerry L. Switzer, 47, of No. 8 College Park Rd., Grinnell, died of cancer Sunday morning, Aug. 5, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Tuesday at the United Church of Christ-Congregational, with the Rev. Philip J. Ramstad, pastor of the church, and the Rev. Daniel I. Ogata, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, officiating. Burial will be in Hazelwood Cemetery.
