

Mrs. Nellie Talbott Funeral Tuesday

Funeral services were Tuesday at the First United Presbyterian Church for Mrs. Nellie Talbott, 80, longtime Brooklyn resident. Mrs. Talbott died suddenly Sunday morning at her Brooklyn home. She had been an invalid for several years.

The Rev. George Roquet, pastor, conducted the 2 p.m. service. Mrs. Ed Bartachek was organist. Interment was in the Brooklyn I.O.O.F. cemetery, with the following serving as pallbearers: George Paul, E. L. Montgomery, C. W. Fowler, Bert Gillette, Lyle Nesselroad and Lynn Montgomery.

Lena Mathews. The family later moved to Cherokee, where she was married to J. E. Talbott, Brooklyn attorney, Oct. 26, 1910. Her husband died in 1965. The couple had five children. A daughter, Irene, died in 1919.

Mrs. Talbott was a member of the Presbyterian church, Order of Eastern Star, of which she was a past worthy matron, and was a former member of Columbian club.
