Funeral Services Held Monday For Henry Terlouw, Sr.

Funeral services were held Monday (May 1) in the First Reformed church in Sully for Henry Terlouw, Sr., 75, who died in the Community hospital in Grinnell Friday morning (April 28).

Funeral services were conducted by the Rev. Maurice Dunker and the Rev. William Pritchard. Mrs. Lloyd Vanderrol accompanied Mrs. Clarence Renaud and Bernard Kooistra who sang "My Wonderful Lord" and "Tis So Sweet To Trust In Jesus."

Clair Schnell, Raymond VanWyk, Herman Jansen, Cornelius Jansen, John H. Jansen and Bennie Dunsbergen were pallbearers.

Mrs. Clair Schnell, Mrs. Robert Collins and Mrs. Bennie Dunsbergen were in charge of the flowers. Interment was in the Sully Cemetery.

Mr. Terlouw was born August 25, 1891, in Sandridge community, near Pella, to Geritt J. and Jennie Elscott Terlouw. He spent his early childhood in this community until moving with his parents to a farm near Killduff in 1902.

Mr. Terlouw was a World War I veteran.

On February 20, 1920, he was united in marriage to Alice Nikkel at Killduff. To this union were born seven children. He farmed just north of Sully where he lived until the time of his death.

Mr. Terlouw is survived by his seven children, Geritt of Sully, James of Lynnville, Ollie of Lynnville, Henry Jr. of Grinnell, Marie and Jennie of Sully and Robert of Kellogg. Also surviving are four brothers and two sisters, Frank of Grinnell, Ben of Killduff, Joe of Oskaloosa, Roy of Lynnville, Jeanette (Mrs. Gerald Roorda) of Lynnville, and Katie of Lynnville.

Mr. Terlouw is also survived by eight grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Alice, on April 28, 1939, his parents, a brother, John O. Terlouw and a sister, Christina (Mrs. John Meppelink).
