John Carl Gustave Tiedemann.

John Carl Gustave Tidemann, born at Damitz. Hanover, Germany, March 1, 1839, died at his home four miles east of Grinnell Saturday, November 17, at 9 p. m., aged 71 years, 8 months and 18 days. Deceased is survived by his wife and eight children: Louis Ticdemann of Malcom, Mrs. Pauline Jentzen of Tama, Mrs. Emma Jentzen and Mrs. Mary Mithelman, of Marshalltown, Fred, John, Lydia and Ella still at the parental home.

In the person of Mr. Tiedemann one of the oldest members of the Lutheran church of Malcom township passed away. He was a member of the Lutheran church from early childhood till death, in this church he was instructed and confirmed in Germany.

As others, Mr. Tiedemann labored at the parental home and in the Fremde, served in the militia and migrated to this new world, settling for the first at Princeton, Ill. This was in 1871. Here he was to find his life-companion in Miss Anna Puls with whom he was united in marriage in 1874. Twenty-seven years ago, in 1887, they came to Poweshiek county, Iowa, and soon became the owners of their present home.

Mr. Tiedemann was physically a strong man and enjoyed unusual good health. Sickness was almost unknown to him. Only once did death enter his home depriving the parents of an infant child. But suddenly a great change took place. A stroke of paralysis, sustained in September, 1908, affected the whole left side of his body and with the use of it the power of speech was partially lost. An at-

ok of pneumonia a year later still ore weakened his health Although r. Tiedemann again recovered he was low unable to rise from his chair or to etire into it without being supported y the members of his family.

Not till three weeks ago, however, id a perceptible change for the worse tin, when he began to fail both body and mentally. Finally pneumonia wain developed and after a week termperated in death.

The remains were laid to rest in the Stemetery of the Lutheran church near Stalcom. Tuesday, November 22, at out p. m. May his body rest in peace et intil reuunited with the immortal soul he sees the glory of the Redecmer and Beredecmed. A. M.
