

## Mrs. Anna Timm Services Sept. 7

Funeral services for Mrs. Anna Timm, formerly of rural Victor, were held Wednesday afternoon, Sept. 7, at St. John's Lutheran Church in Victor. The Rev. Edmond Weiss officiated.

A mixed choir provided vocal music with Mrs. Edward Bierbaum as organist. Mr. and Mrs. Clark Hinrichs and Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Weiss were in charge of flowers. Serving as casket bearers were grandsons Randal Timm, Paul Morrison, Gary Timm, James Timm, Ro-

bert Ranfeld and Fred Timm. Burial was in St. John's cemetery in Lincoln township.

Mrs. Timm, 87, died Sunday morning, Sept. 4, at the Marengo Memorial Hospital.

Mrs. Timm was the former Anna Susanne Meyer. She was born on Oct. 27, 1878, in Sittensen, Hanover, Germany, the daughter of Wilhelm and Maria Bronkust Meyer.

She was baptized, confirmed and received her elementary education in Germany and in 1893 the family came to the United States and settled in Lincoln township, Iowa County.

On Feb. 23, 1898, she married Ernest Timm. They were the parents of 12 children, including an adopted son. She was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church and lived most of her life in the Victor community.

Due to failing health she had been cared for by members of her family and for the past few years she lived in Malcom.

Survivors include 11 children: Mrs. Ernest (Marie) Baethke of Decorah; Mrs. Lacy (Emma) Doty of Deep River; Mrs. Frank (Martha) Horn of Pleasantville; Mrs. Bert (Florence) Ranfeld of Guernsey; Forest of Conrad; Albert of Victor; Raymond of Baxter; Ernest of Ladora; Arthur of Deep River; Mrs. Bud (Agnus) Morrison of Malcom; and Fred, an adopted son, of Malcom.

Also surviving are 40 grandchildren; 77 great grandchildren and three great-great grandchildren.

## Mrs. Timm Was Native Of Hanover, Germany

ANNA SUSANNE MEYER TIMM born in Sittensen, Hanover, Germany, Oct. 27, 1878. Her parents were Wilhelm and Maria Bronkust Meyer. She was baptized Nov. 10, 1878, instructed and confirmed on March 30, 1893, and received her elementary education in Germany.

Soon thereafter she emigrated to the United States with her parents, settling in Lincoln twp., Iowa county, Iowa.

On Feb. 23, 1898, she was united in marriage with Ernest Timm. To this union 11 children were born, and the couple also adopted one boy. With husband and family, she was part of the "St. John's Lutheran" community.

In old age, she met with slowly failing health. After the death of her husband, she was cared for by members of the family, and during the last few years, she lived at Malcom. She passed away Sept. 4, 1966.
