Max Todd Dies In Davenport

Max Wayne Todd, 39, of 3127 Oxford Drive, Bettendorf, died Thursday morning, Sept. 26, at a Davenport hospital. He had been ill for several months.

The son of Cyrus Floyd and Pearl Bogart Todd, Mr. Todd was born Dec. 16, 1928, at Newton. He attended the Grinnell schools and was graduated from Grinnell high school with the class of '47.

On Sept. 25, 1948, he married Dorothy Simon at Lancaster, Mo. To this union three daughters were born—Karen Diane, Michelle Kay, and Tamera Jo.

Mr. Todd had lived in Newton, San Diego, Calif., Grinnell, and a year ago had moved to Bettendorf. He was employed as a sales representative for the Bell Telephone Co. While in Grinnell he worked for the Preston, Reimer, and Star clothing stores and had traveled for several years as a men's clothing salesman. He had been a member of the Elks Lodge in Grinnell and was a member of Mac's Club, a traveling salesmen's organization, in Bettendorf.

Survivors include his mother, Mrs. Pearl Todd of 1407 Sixth Ave., Grinnell; his widow Dorothy; his three daughters; one brother, Eugene Todd of Sparks, Nev.; and one sister, Mrs. Gerald (Janice) Wang of Rte. 2, Malcom.
