Rites Held For Mrs. Robt. Tone

Mrs. Robert L. Tone, Gilman, died Thursday at a Marshalltown hospital where she had been a patient since June. She had been in ill health for the past year and a half.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon from the Gilman Community church with the Rev. Donald Gibson officiating. Interment was in Prairie View cemetery at Gilman.

Born Aug. 13th, 1896 near Gilman, she was the daughter of John and Abi Ramsey Frankforth. When she was only eight years old, her mother died. Mrs. Tone spent her girlhood in Gilman, Grinnell, and Des Moines and graduated from high school

in the latter community.
