Harold, the son of Fred and Anna Uphoff, was born Feb. 2, 1905 at Gladbrook. He was baptized in the Evangelical Lutheran church.

After his mother's death at the age of seven years, he was placed in the Soldiers' and Sailors' Orphanage at Davenport. At the age of nine, Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Spading took him into their home and from then on he went by the name of Harold Spading. The Spadings rearred him and sent him through school, and he graduated from the Brooklyn high school in 1925.

Harold spent most of his life in the vicinity of Malcom until his marriage to Mabel Hodgson on Mar. 5, 1950. To this union one daughter was born. After their marriage they lived in the Victor community for some time, and for the past seven years had lived in the vicinity of Millersburg. At the time of his death, they were living in Millersburg. Harold was working for the Carder equipment company west of Millersburg, where he had a heart attack and passed away in the shop, Tuesday morning, Dec. 20. He had reached the age of 55 years, 10 months, and 18 days.

He is survived by his wife, Mabel; a daughter, Donna; a sister, Mrs. Louise Jensen, Garwin; five step-children, Kenneth Hodgson, now serving with the United States Army in Germany, Arlene Lamb, Montezuma,

Marlin, Viola and Bruce, at home; three grandchildren; several nieces and nephews, other relatives and many friends.

Funeral services were held from the McAninch chapel, Thursday, Dec. 22, at 2 o'clock, with the Rev. H. Foxworthy, pastor of the Millersburg Methodist church, officiating. Two organ solos were played by Mrs. George Keller, "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Beyond the Sunset." Burial was in the Malcom cemetery.
