

## Teunis Van Maanen

Teunis Van Maanen, 83, of rural Lynnville died Saturday, Nov. 2, at Grinnell General Hospital.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday at the First Reformed Church in Sully, with the Revs. B. Daniel Hakken and Ralph Menning officiating. Burial was in Sully Cemetery.
