Lynnville woman dies in accident

A 43-year-old rural Lynnville woman died Tuesday, the apparent victim of a machinery accident on the family farm.

Dead is Mrs. Jane Ann Van Wyk, whose body was found near a tractor and disking

machine by a passerby Tuesday morning. An autopsy was scheduled Friday to determine the exact cause of death, although authorities said Mrs. Van Wyk was run over by the disking machine. There were no apparent

witnesses to the accident. Funeral services for Mrs. Van Wyk were held at 2 p.m. Saturday at the First Reformed Church of Sully. The Rev. Wayne Tripp and the Rev. Fred Van Houten officiated. Burial was at the Sully

Cemetery, with the Pella Garden Chapel in charge of arrangements.

A memorial in Mrs. Van Wyk's name has been established with the Christian Opportunity Center in Pella.
