

Rites Held At Hartwick For ^{H-12} Mrs. Godfrey Veit ₁₋₁₉₋₁₉₆₁

Mrs. Godfrey (Jennie) Veit, 82, prominent Hartwick resident, died Sunday at a Grinnell hospital where she had been a patient since late last month. She had been in failing health the past two years.

Funeral services were held Tuesday at the Hartwick Congregational church with the Rev. Kenneth Berg of Springfield, Mo., a former Hartwick pastor, and the Rev. R. E. Cutbirth, officiating. Music was furnished by Mrs. Calvin Korn and Mrs. Clair Erickson.

Assisting with the flowers were Mrs. William Korn, Mrs. William Starry, Mrs. August Hensler and Mr. and Mrs. Marvin Gritsch. Pallbearers were Kenneth Benda, Nelson Korn, Waldo McLennan, Harlan Wessell, Ward Fearneyhough and Clarence Possehl.

She was born Oct. 12th, 1878 near Chelsea, one of 13 children of John and Abigail Craft Ryan. She graduated from Brooklyn high school in 1895, attended Western College in Toledo and Cornell College in Mt. Vernon and later taught school in Poweshiek and Tama counties.

On Oct. 6th, 1909, she was united in marriage with Godfrey Veit in Chelsea and shortly after their marriage they moved to the present farm home near Brooklyn.

They were the parents of two daughters, Mrs. Harold Goodman of Millersburg and Mrs. Milton Cronbaugh of Hartwick. Besides her husband and daughters, she is survived by eight grandchildren and one brother, Orie Ryan of Malcom.

Mrs. Veit was a member of the Hartwick Congregational church, the Community Welfare Workers Club and the Rector Cemetery Assn.
