

Rites Held for Mr. Veverka

Edward Veverka, 50, of Brooklyn died while on duty as night marshal for the town of Brooklyn Sunday night. He was dead on arrival at Grinnell General Hospital.

The son of Edward D. and Vlasta Swatosh Veverka, he was born Aug. 30, 1924, near

Carnsforth. He received his elementary education in Guernsey and graduated from Brooklyn High School in 1943. He served with the U.S. Army from 1943 to 1946 and spent 13 months in the Philippines. He was married to Merna Pariseau Feb. 22, 1958, in Brooklyn. He was a member of the Methodist church and Francis Gallagher American Legion Post No. 294.

Survivors include his wife; one son, Rynnie L. Pariseau, serving with the U.S. Air Force in Thailand; a daughter, Renee Lynnette Pariseau of Brooklyn; his mother, Mrs. Vlasta Veverka of Brooklyn; and two grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his father in 1960.

Funeral services for Mr. Veverka were held at 2 p.m. Thursday at the Grace United Methodist Church in Brooklyn, with the Rev. J. Arthur Eveland officiating. Burial was in the I.O.O.F. Cemetery in Victor, with military rites conducted by the Francis Gallagher American Legion Post.
