Rites Held For Orville Walker, Gilman Resident

GILMAN (Special) — Funeral services for Orville L. Walker, 45, well known Gilman business man who died Saturday morning at a Marshalltown hospital, were held Tuesday afternoon at the Gilman Methodist church.

Officiating was the Rev. Norman Kauble, pastor of the church. Interment was Prairie View cemetery at Gilman.

The son of Roy E. and Tilla Rasp Walker, he was born Nov. 17th, 1917, near Newburg. He attended the Newburg public schools and during World War II served with the infantry in the European theatre.

On Sept. 12th, 1939, he was united in marriage with Frances Jean Clay and they made their home in the Gilman area. Until five years ago, Mr. Walker was associated with his father and brothers in the Walker and Sons Grocery. Since that time he had been associated with the New York Life Insurance Co. and Life Investors of Iowa.

Mr. Walker was a member of the Gilman Methodist church, the Methodist Men's Club, and Paul-Ward Post No. 149 of the American Legion in Gilman.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by three children, Judy Walker, a teacher in the Danville schools, and John, 16, and Joyce, 10, both at home. Also surviving are two brothers, Denver of Gilman and Wendell of Marshalltown; and one sister, Mrs. James Butcher of Newton.
