Jennie Gertrude Watson, 67,  
of Montezuma died Tuesday,  
Jan. 24, at Grinnell General  
Hospital.

Funeral services for Jennie  
Watson were held at 1:30 p.m.  
Saturday at the United  
Methodist Church in Mon-  
tezuma, with the Rev. James  
Nicholson officiating. Music

Johnson, vocalist.
