

John D. White *Bc Dec. 16, 1998*

Funeral services were Monday afternoon, Dec. 14, at the Nevenhoven Funeral Home in Brooklyn for John D. White, 90, of Brooklyn, who died Friday, Dec. 11, 1998, in Brookhaven Nursing Home in Brooklyn.

The Rev. Ronald Van Heukelom, pastor of the First Presbyterian Church, officiated, and the musician was Marilyn Kriegel. Flower attendants were Roger and Nancy Roudabush. John D. White, son of Almon White and Julia Tesar White, was born near Brooklyn on May 7, 1908. He received his education in a rural school.

On Aug. 26, 1929, he married Madeline DeMeulenaere in Cedar Rapids. Following their marriage, they farmed near Guernsey and Tama before moving to Brooklyn. Mrs. White died in May of 1968. In recent years John has been a resident of Brookhaven Nursing Home.

John enjoyed his farm and cutting wood.

Preceding him in death was his wife, and survivors are his two daughters and their husbands, Dottie and Kenneth Johnston of Brooklyn and Mary and Robert Denton of Grinnell; three sisters, Florence Williams, Neva Johnson and Jean Van Ersvelde, all of Brooklyn; six grandchildren; 13 great-grandchildren; and two great-great-granddaughters.
